- Leadership skills and service learning

### Sample Program Itinerary

- Day 1 - Travel to Mancos, CO; overnight near Mesa Verde
- Day 2 - Mesa Verde National Park; fire management issues in the region
- Day 3 - Hovenweep National Park; conduct research on impact of sound
- Day 4 - Ancestral Puebloan ruins; desert ecology; travel to Navajo reservation
- Day 5 - Canyon de Chelly National Park; overlooks and White House hike
- Day 6 - Service in Canyon de Chelly; camp in canyon; Navajo storytelling and music
- Day 7 - Hike out of Canyon campsite; Hubbell Trading Post; return to Mancos
- Day 8 - Return home!

We emphasize authentic, hands-on travel experiences. While traveling, students explore the rich cultural and natural diversity of the Southwest through sights and activities including:

- Conduct hands-on science through a partnership with the National Parks Service Natural Sounds Program
- Discover the unique geology and ecology of the region firsthand

#### Included - Price Breakdown

#### Accommodations

We will spend some nights in dormitory-style housing: rustic but comfortable with access to clean bathrooms. The rest of the trip will be camping with basic to limited facilities. Tents provided for camping, with sleeping bags and pads available to rent.

#### Recommended Age and Maturity Level

This program is specifically designed for middle and high school students. However, workshop activities can be modified for college or adult participants. Maturity level should be considered when determining whether students are appropriate candidates for this program.

#### Safety

We take this topic seriously and ask that all workshop participants do the same. We take an enormous amount of care in preparing our workshops to minimize safety risks, and we have created rules and regulations accordingly. It is very important that all travelers obey the rules and regulations set forth by Group Sponsors, on-site Global Explorers staff, guides and lodge managers.

#### Physical Fitness

All of our workshops are designed for adventurous participants! This workshop involves several hikes of moderate difficulty through desert weather and terrain. We suggest participants prepare both physically and mentally for their workshops in order to get the most out of their experience.
